Our computer system chooses which ideas to show

Green thumb up means you **agree** with the idea



Click the **green thumb up** if you **agree**.

If you disagree



Red thumb down means you disagree with the idea



Click the **red thumb down** if you **disagree**.

If you are not sure

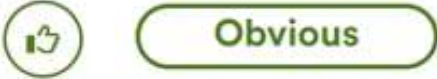


Grey thumb sideways means you are not sure about this idea.



Click the **grey thumbs sideways** if you are **not sure** about this idea.

Explain your answer (optional)

	You can tell us why you chose that answer. You do not have to do this.
	Favourite means this idea is very important to me.
	Obvious means many people already agree with this idea.
	Realistic means this idea could happen in real life.
	Unrealistic means this idea would not work in real life.



Hate this

Hate this means I do not agree with this idea at all.



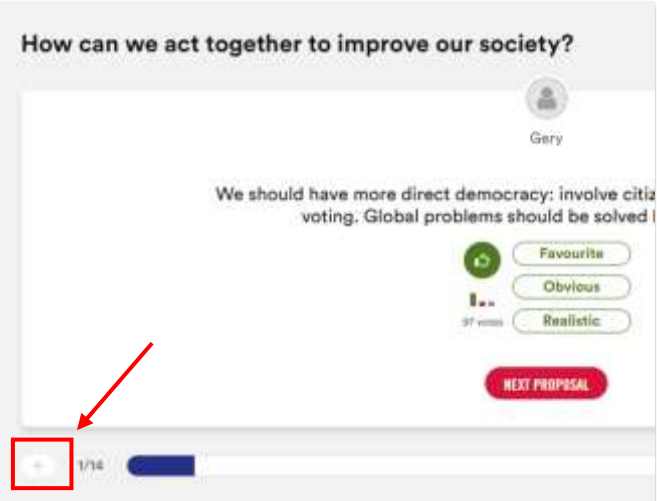
Nonsense

Nonsense means this idea does not make sense to me.

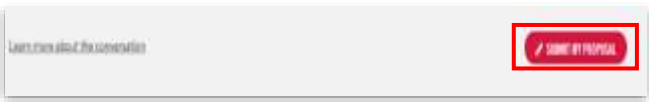

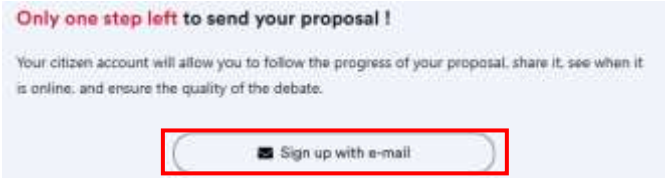
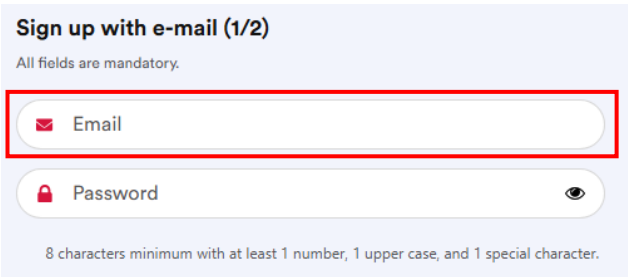
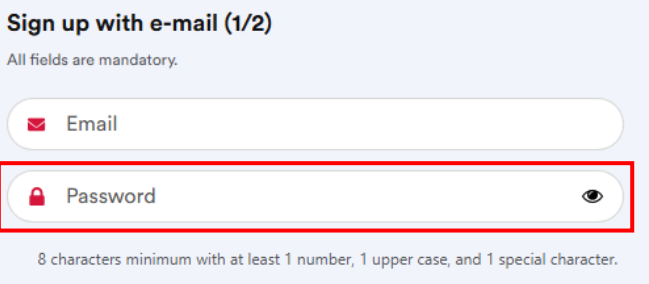
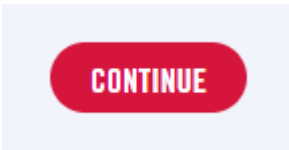
No opinion means I do not have a strong view about this idea.

Sharing an idea (optional)

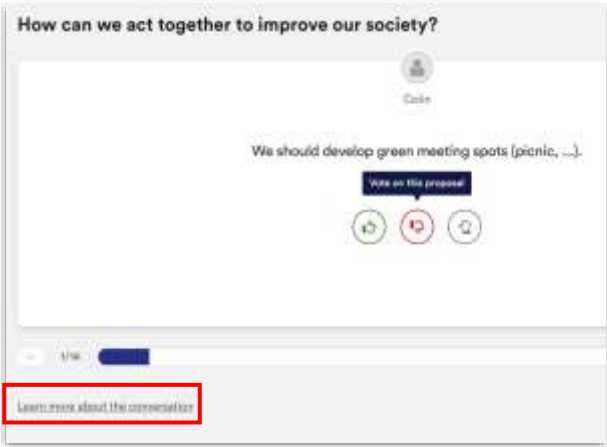
	After you have looked at some ideas from other people, you can share your own idea. Or you can keep reading and responding to ideas from other people.
	Sharing an idea To share an idea, click "Submit"
	Your idea must: • Start with the words "We should" • Be short and clear
	To submit your idea, click "Submit my proposal"
	You need an account before you can share an idea.

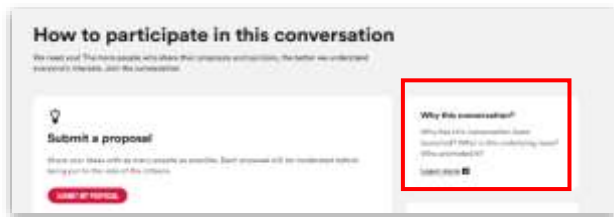
Creating an account (optional)

	Click, “Sign-up with e-mail” to create an account.
	Enter your e-mail address into the “Email” box.
	Enter your password into the “Password” box.
	Your password must include: 1 number 1 upper case letter 1 special character
	Enter your email address and password. Then click "Continue".
